Here are some characteristics of Mid-Century Modern style to keep in mind when creating this look in your home:

- Lots of natural wood (not just floors, but also go for cabinets, furniture, walls and even ceilings!)
- Floor to Ceiling windows and sliding doors
- Warm, neutral color pallets with pops of bright color
- Geometric shapes and patterns
- Minimal knick-knack décor and ornamentation to accentuate clean lines
- Functionality is key- form follows function in Mid-Century Modern design
- Furniture: Low-standing furniture with shorter backs, tapered legs (wider at the top and narrower at the bottom) at an angle. Understated or absent drawer knobs and handles
- Lighting: Bubble Pendants, Sputnik Chandeliers, Overarching floor lamps
- Fabrics: Tweed, orange/brown leather, the occasional use of velvet
- Art: Abstract Expressionism in simple frames
